## Cultural Festival


Tereora College is set to perform in this year's Cultural Festival tonight. This will be the first night of competition and one that is sure to be a fire-cracker.

## Visiting Forensic Scientists

Science classrooms were packed on Friday afternoon as students gathered to listen to forensic scientist Heidi Baker. Heidi works for the Environmental and Science Research (ESR) group based in Auckland and is part of a team of forensic scientists involved in investigating crime scenes. She was visiting Rarotonga to work with the Cook Islands Police last week and managed to spare some time to talk to Tereora College students.

Heidi talked about her career pathway and how she became a forensic scientist. She then discussed the purpose of her role and what it is like to work as a scientist, gathering, analysing and using evidence to uncover what really happened at a crime scene. This includes time spend at crime scenes, in labs and in courts explaining the science behind the evidence being presented. Students were fascinated by Heidi's stories as she recalled her first murder scene and showed how no crime is the perfect crime – there is always some kind of evidence left behind. Time at the end of her presentation allowed students to ask interesting questions. She was keen to be available to answer any questions to support students moving into a Science career. Mr Easterbrook has her contact details should any student have questions they would like to ask. Heidi then had the weekend free to explore this beautiful island with her young child before returning to Auckland.
