#### **PHYSICS IN PARADISE**

Something unique is happening for Physics students at Tereora College. Due to the shortage of Physics teachers, this year's Level 3 Physics students are learning online, but in a different way. Every lesson their online teacher, Dr. Des Duthie, greets them from his home in New Zealand and becomes their teacher.

His image is projected onto a screen at the front of the room and his students can hear him as he explains the complex world of Physics. Duthie can also show presentations and videos to help his students learn concepts. If students have questions they can ask Duthie, who can answer them immediately.

Duthie is no stranger to the Cook Islands, having spent five years in Rarotonga as the Head of Science and Physics teacher at Tereora College from

2012 to 2016. He is well aware of Cook Islands students learning needs and their learning environment.

Also in the room is John Jones Eliu. Eliu recently graduated with a teaching degree in Science and has returned to the Cook Islands to teach. He is currently teaching Junior Science and Level 2 Physics. By sitting in with the Level 3 Physics students Eliu can further support the students as well as learn from Duthie, so Tereora College can have a Physics teacher for the future. To date the online programme is going well and students are learning a lot. Because this type of teaching and learning is new, Eliu and Duthie are working together to make improvements for student learning as the year progresses. Despite the steep learning curve for both teachers they are pleased with the proaress made so far.
