

It's a privilege to have been nominated to attend this Young Enviroleaders Forum (YELF) to represent our School, Tereora College, and our nation, the Cook Islands. It was a great opportunity to make a lot of new friends from all over New Zealand and some from the Pacific Islands and to experience how to make a positive difference for the planet through activities that

encourage and inspire environmental awareness and leadership in action. I was able to be part of an experiential learning program in the Royal New Zealand Navy run by the Leadership Development Group (LDG), based in Devonport Naval Base. I got the chance to see and experience the sea-men training, leadership training, and was also able to go on the RIHB Blast to end the day with a chill. This program helped me discover behavioural qualities that I did not realise I had, and ways I could improve and develop my leadership qualities as an individual and in a team. I also had the


